

DART D2 is simmering - waiting on word from the Feds that we got the grant money, and that Obama's budget includes the appropriation. They want to get D2 operational before High Speed Rail shows up, which may or may not actually happen.

Downtown 360 is wrapping up the public input phase and synthesizing information. The feedback has been fairly consistent about prioritizing people, connectivity, green space, etc....you know, places where people actually want to live.

Mission Statement

The Residents Council is a group of involved downtown Dallas residents who wish to improve the quality of life and make their neighborhood feel more like a community.

Council Objectives

A group of downtown residents from various residential properties who work to:

- Provide a platform for residents to be heard.
- Give residents a voice as one group instead of fragmented individuals.
- Bring issues to the forefront at City Hall on behalf of residents.
- Establish avenues for residents to volunteer or become subcommittee members.
- Promote downtown as a neighborhood and a great place to live, work, and play by sharing their personal experience of downtown living.

Downtown Residential Council Committee (DRCC)

Residential properties consisting of at least 20 units may have one committee member and one alternate. Properties with a smaller number of units may be combined to have one committee member and one alternate. Each of these residential properties will be located within the established boundaries of the DRC, which are: Woodall Rogers Freeway / SR 36 to the north, Stemmons Freeway / IH 35 to the west, E R Thornton Freeway / IH 30 to the south, and Central Expressway / US 75 to the east.

Subcommittees will be formed (dealing with Safety, Emergency Preparedness, Policy and Advocacy, Council Activities and Volunteering, Family Activities, Parks / Streetscape / Neighborhood Beautification, Art and Culture, and Social), and may have their own meetings with their own membership and a degree of independence from the DRCC. Subcommittee chairs will be selected from the DRCC and will present the activities of the subcommittees to the DRCC.

Committee members will have been downtown residents for a period of at least one year, and will be appointed by the existing DRCC members from volunteers which were recommended by other existing committee members or by building management. The appointment will last until the committee member moves to a different building, resigns, or is asked to leave the committee by the majority vote of the DRCC members. An alternate committee member will be designated by the primary building representative to attend meetings in case of absence. This alternate may become the committee member if a position is vacated, in which case another alternate will be chosen.

The Committee Chair will have been a member of the committee for a minimum of two years, and will be elected by the DRCC members for a two year term at the first meeting of each odd numbered year.

Downtown Dallas, Inc. / DDI

DDI assists the DRC in coordinating meetings, events, and administration, but has no influence in policy established by the DRCC.
