State housing agency awards \$400,000 to maintain homeownership in Queen City

(AUSTIN) — The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) and State Representative Stephen J. Frost today announced a \$400,000 award to the City of Queen City to fund home repairs for low income homeowners, helping residents maintain homeownership while providing a shot in the arm to the local economy.

City officials anticipate the funds will help rehabilitate five homes owned and lived in by income eligible households.

“This is good news for qualifying homeowners in Queen City who have an opportunity to benefit from this special home repair program,” said Representative Frost. “It is gratifying to know some of our friends and neighbors who currently live in substandard conditions will soon enjoy the advantages of a new or substantially improved home. This is an outstanding occasion for our community. I appreciate TDHCA’s continued commitment to Texas homeowners.”

“Repairing substandard housing is a critical mission of the Department, as it helps preserve homeownership and the health of smaller communities,” said Michael Gerber, TDHCA Executive Director. “It also has the potential to generate numerous construction jobs and the payroll, taxes, and fees that help provide essential services at the local level. We are certain this award will contribute to an improved quality of life for Queen City and its residents.”

TDHCA awards home repair funds to qualifying applicants through the Department’s HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, which helps repair or replace homes owned and lived in by low income homeowners.

Assistance may include roof repair or replacement, as well as repairs to the electrical and plumbing systems. If a home has deteriorated to the point it no longer is cost effective to repair, it may be demolished and replaced either by a traditional “site built” home or a manufactured home.

Qualifying applicants include eligible cities and counties, public housing authorities, Community Housing Development Organizations and other nonprofit housing groups, and certain for-profit organizations which then work with eligible households at the local level.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is the funding source for the HOME Program. The program serves households earning no more than 80 percent of the area median family income, which for Queen City equals an annual income of \$37,200 for a family for four.
