State housing agency, local nonprofit helping area low income tenants secure decent housing

(AUSTIN) — Realizing that helping low income tenants secure decent affordable rental housing is the first step to setting them on the path toward self-sufficiency, the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) has announced a major funding award to a Springtown-based nonprofit organization to help eligible individuals obtain housing while working toward financial and personal independence.

TDHCA awarded \$300,000 in rental assistance funds to Affordable Housing of Parker County to help an estimated 14 households residing in Parker and Wise counties with their monthly rent payments.

“Finding a decent, affordable place to call home can be an enormous challenge for many families, particularly those living in smaller communities,” said TDHCA Executive Director Michael Gerber. “Incomes tend to be lower, and residents typically have fewer rental housing choices. These funds will not only make an immediate impact on the lives of area tenants, they have the potential to create the long-term benefits of self-reliance.”

Affordable Housing of Parker County will use the award to help subsidize rents and make security and utility deposits for eligible low income individuals, ensuring they find decent, affordable rental housing. The assistance is portable, meaning the tenant is not restricted to living in a particular apartment complex, and is available for up to 24 months.

In return, tenants must participate in a self-sufficiency program with the goal of achieving eventual financial independence. Self-sufficiency programs vary, depending on the population served. Programs may include drug dependency classes, job training, college degree programs, and parenting training and GED classes.

This award was made through TDHCA's HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, which is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Eligible applicants include qualifying units of local government, public housing authorities, Community Housing Development Organizations and other nonprofit groups, and qualifying for-profit organizations.
