## **EHV Program Background**

The Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) program is a tenant-based voucher program funded through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA)

ARPA was signed into law on March 11, 2021, and included funding for approximately 70,000 EHVs. Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) was allocated 798 vouchers by the US Department of Housing and Community Affairs

EHV requires the PHA to sign agreements with Continuums of Care, victim service providers or other organizations to administer the program

## **EHV Program Background**

EHV Eligible Populations:

- 1) Homeless,
- 2) At risk of homelessness,



- 3) Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, or
- Recently homeless families for whom providing rental assistance will prevent the family's homelessness or having a high risk of housing instability.

## **TDHCA Program Design and Partnerships**

The Department is 1 of 45 Texas PHAs awarded EHVs by HUD

Texas PHAs awarded 4,517 EHVs

The Department's Board approved the EHV program design July 8, 2021, defining the service area as:


Primarily includes the Department's current PHA jurisdiction plus other areas of the state where EHVs were not received by PHAs, which include rural areas, within the limits of having local service providers willing and able to make referrals

## **TDHCA Program Design and Partnerships**

Texas Homeless Network EHV Allocation: 380 Counties Served: 186 Referrals: 62 Housed: 2 Heart of Texas Homeless Coalition EHV Allocation: 50 Counties Served: 4 Referrals: 0 Housed: 0

- Counties served overlap some PHA service areas that were allocated their own EHVs
- Unallocated EHVs: 278

## **Pathways Home Report Review**

- <u>Objective</u>: To coordinate state-administered programs with Continuum of Care planning to address homelessness and provide pathways home for Texans.
- Categories
  - Affordable Housing and Supportive Services
  - Homelessness Prevention
  - Data, Research, and Analysis
  - State Infrastructure
- Published in late 2012 10 year gap








## **Pathways Home Report Review (cont.)**

  - Homeless resource and service delivery targeted and mainstream
  - State and federal policy environment
  - COVID-19 impact
- Background research to substantiate recommendations
  - National research
  - State data analysis
- Soliciting feedback TICH Members/ Advisory Members, service providers
  - Survey TICH
  - Informational interviews TICH, service providers
  - Work groups TICH

• **<u>Purpose</u>**: WGs will function as collaborative brainstorming and planning forums to inform the new plan.

#### Open Meetings Act restrictions:

- No more than 6 TICH Member participants permitted per WG; no quorum permitted
- WG has no decision-making authority
- WG may make reports to the full Council
  - Deliberation on reports and voting may take place at a public meeting posted on the Texas Register

\*Possible options for the fourth category include "Emergency Response Planning" and "Subpopulations/ Demographics" or omitting the fourth category and retaining the first three categories; these options are open for discussion


THN is a statewide agency that...





To Date 2022 Monthly median training events are up 20% from this point in 2021













